Monday Library Closure

The Scripps Miramar Ranch Library has been closed on Mondays, as of September 15, due to City budget issues. Staff Transitions

There has been a major turnover of staff at our library and most others citywide related to the loss of Monday library hours. Our branch manager, Phil Gunderson, has moved back to the Central Library where he will head up Access Services; SRFOL wishes him well in his new position. We have lost our Youth Services Librarian and will truly miss Melissa Barbour who shared her enthusiasm and creativity with the Scripps Ranch community for 7+ years. Our new branch manager is Zeina Guion, who comes to us from the Central Library. Additional staff changes have occurred as well, although there are a couple of familiar staff faces remaining at our library. SRFOL welcomes new staff members and is looking forward to working with Zeina and our new library staff team! Upcoming Library Closure and Parking Lot Updates

The latest official word is that our library will remain open through the end of December. The planned closure of our library for replacement of the roof and HVAC system will not start until the new year. The closure is projected to last at least 8–10 months. We have also been informed that work on the lower parking lot, which has been suspended for the past 18 months, may restart sometime in October.

Programs for Children and Teens

- *Kamishibai* StoryBox Theatre: Tuesday, October 17, from 10:00 to 10:30 am. Note time change from the past. Presented by Write Out Loud San Diego, "StoryBox" is the American name given to the Japanese storytelling tradition called *kamishibai*. StoryBox combines dramatic storytelling with a wooden theatre to showcase illustrations in an engaging family-friendly storytime experience for all ages. We are hoping to be able to bring this program back next month.

Programs for Adults

- Fun and Games for Seniors: Join a convivial group of community members to play a variety of board games, etc. on Tuesdays from 12:30 to 3:00 pm and Thursdays from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm. In collaboration with Scripps Ranch 50 Plus.
- **Knitting Group:** The knitting group meets in the Seminar Room on Tuesdays from 12 to 2:30 pm. Open to all ages and skill levels. Learn the art of knitting. Bring a pair of needles, and we'll help get you going; yarn available if needed. See how much fun and gratifying knitting can be!

- Scripps Mesa Garden Club: Tuesday, October 23, from 5:30 to 7:30 pm. Monthly speakers on a variety of topics of interest to gardeners. The group tours also tours members' gardens and goes on outings to interesting nurseries and farms.

Book Discussion Group

There has been a change in the schedule due to lack of availability of the original October selection, *Norwegian Wood* by Haruki Marukami. Thus, for October, the traditional **Potluck Meeting** at which books are chosen for the upcoming year, will be held in the library's Seminar Room on Thursday, October 23, at 12:30 pm. Bring a dish to share and come prepared to suggest up to 3 of your favorite titles (please make sure that there are at least 12 copies in the library system, check to see how many "holds" the title has, and make a note of the number of pages). New members are welcome! November's selection is *Holidays on Ice* by David Sedaris; note that the November meeting will be on the 13th due to the Thanksgiving holiday. And, for December, the group will be discussing *Norwegian Wood* on Thursday, December 4, another change from the normal 4th Thursday, because of holiday season conflicts. Copies of the books will available at the circulation desk.
